- Flowers in bloom from June 2-8:
 - Salomon's seal, Wild lily-of-the-valley, False spikenard/Solomon's seal, Bunchberry, Twining honeysuckle, Starflower, Arrow-wood, Mountain maple, High-bush cranberry, Aniseroot, Sweet cicely, Yellow violets, Daisy fleabane, Clintonia (Blue-bead lily), Chickweed, Dewberry, Sarsaparilla, Columbine, Canada milkvetch, Tufted vetch, Canada anemone, Wood betony, Yellow lady's slipper, Poison ivy, Nodding trillium, Blue-eyed grass, Twin flower, Wild rose, Ox-eye daisy, Yellow hawkweed, Indian paintbrush, Wild calla, white/Alsike clover, Black medick, Northern bush honeysuckle, Blackberry, Red-osier dogwood.
- Thursday, June 2:
 - 11:30 a.m. temperature 62°F, NW wind 12 mph, partial sun.
- Saturday, June 4:
 - Chicken-of-the-woods and Oyster Shell mushrooms are out.
 - Dragonfly seen eating a cabbage moth
 - Birds seen include: Rose breasted Grosbeak, Red eyed Vireo Ovenbird, Common Yellowthroat, Blackburnian Warbler, Pine Warbler, Yellow Rumped Warbler, Black and White Warbler, Northern Parula, Yellow Warbler, Nashville Warbler, American Redstart, Chestnut Sided Warbler, American Crow, Bluejay, Phoebe, Black capped Chickadee, Chipping Sparrow, American Robin, Cedar Waxwing, Alder Flycatcher, White throated Sparrow, Red Winged Blackbird, Swamp Sparrow, Veery, White breasted Nuthatch, Red breasted Nuthatch, Eastern Wood PeeWee, Hairy Woodpecker
- Sunday, June 5:
 - Showy lady's slipper stems ranging in height from 5 to 13-inches tall.
 - Afternoon scattered rain showers.
 - Garter snake seen near the headwaters area.
 - Dragonflies very active.
- Monday, June 6:
 - Scattered rain showers throughout the day. Temperature reached mid-60°F.
 - baby geese are getting larger, getting gray down feathers.
- Tuesday, June 7:
 - Two baby fawns seen with the doe near a small pond.
 - Snapping turtles finish laying eggs.
 - Snapping turtle eggs are being dug up.
 - Raccoon seen along South Entrance Road.
 - Swans are still sitting on nests.
